CRISIS MANAGEMENT A One Health perspective

Duration: - 3 days preparation online work prior to the course - 5 days in-person instruction

Location: Partially online, partially in person; the 5-day inperson session will take place at ENSV-FVI* (Marcy l'Etoile, France) and involve a field trip to Paris (DGAI, ANSES, OIE) *May be adapted to a remote training depending on the sanitary situation

- Veterinary Officers (e.g., government veterinary officials, administrators of veterinary institutions or agricultural organisations)

- Management staff from public or private organisations involved in public health responses

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CONTEXT

The COVID-19 pandemic shows that efficient crisis management requires professionals with specific skills who can be quickly mobilised.

Health crises have major impacts and are complex to manage. It is necessary to properly structure efforts and organise all the key players with an influence on regional and national response effectiveness.

PROGRAMME

Main objective:

To share operational knowledge and gain practical skills related to animal health crisis management. Participants will learn how to prepare for and manage crises, including best practices and effective communication.

Learning objectives:

By the end of the course, participants will understand the core principles of crisis management and will be able to:

- Propose an operational organization structure that connects all relevant organisations
- Identify key partners to ensure an efficient response
- Propose technical measures to deal with infectious disease outbreaks
- Know the main information to share when communicating with the public during a crisis

Course Content:

Presentations and feedback will provide participants with an overview of the different levels of action during a crisis.

This course is structured around four main axes:

- Organisation—a description of the interdisciplinary links between different government services
- Technical responses—first-hand accounts from government staff involved in the public health response during the ASF or AI crisis
- Partnerships—contributions from veterinarians, stakeholders associated with various public health groups, and laboratory representatives
- Communication—a description of the essential language elements needed when communicating with the public

The course has two parts:

- Three days of online work
- A five-day in-person session at ENSV

Teaching methods:

The online part of the course will take place via the VetagroTice platform and will include videos, slide shows, resource readings, and practical exercises.

During the in-person session, participants will share their experiences, attend lectures, and go on field trips.

Prerequisites

Minimum of 3 to 5 years of relevant professional working experience.
