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# **CONTEXT**

The World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) is the intergovernmental organisation responsible for improving animal health and welfare worldwide. The OIE develops standards that its 182 Members can use to protect themselves from incursions of diseases or pathogens while avoiding unjustified trade barriers. The World Trade Organization (WTO) recognises the OIE as the international reference organisation for ensuring the sanitary safety of international trade of animals and animal products. e-CERISE has been designed to facilitate the implementation of OIE standards. This module will provide you with a generic introduction of the OIE.
