# **CONTEXT**

Veterinary Services (VS) in accordance with WOAH international standards and based on the principles of good veterinary governance contribute to an effective and sustainable global system that meets the current and future health needs of society. They should have the capacity and resources to respond, in particular, to natural, accidental or deliberate spread of pathogens, and be able to implement surveillance, early detection, rapid response and biosecurity measures. Effective VS are thus a global public good, contributing to veterinary public health, food safety and security, and poverty reduction.

## **PROGRAMME**

# Main objective:

At the end of this module, participants will be able to understand the basic principles of the quality of Veterinary Services and the criteria for the evaluation of Veterinary Services by the WOAH.

## Learning objectives:

- Describe and understand the basic principles of quality and criteria for evaluating Veterinary Services;
- Analyse, on the basis of a practical case study, the national strengths and weaknesses in the quality of Veterinary Services;
- Be aware of the general principles of veterinary communication and legislation, which are essential for good governance in the veterinary domain.

# **Course Content:**

General introduction on Veterinary Services and the WOAH PVS Tool

- Basic principles of quality and criteria for evaluating Veterinary Services,
- General principles of veterinary communication and legislation,
- Preparation of a summary note presenting the main national strenghts and weaknesses in the quality of Veterinary Services.

### Teaching methods:

- Introductory and evaluation webinar of the module

- Practical case studies, exercises (production of summary documents)
