Definition of Veterinary Public Health

The FVI Partnership, as part of its activities within the ENSV-FVI's "International Actions" department, refers to the definition of VPH provided by the French Veterinary Academy¹:

"Veterinary public health is defined as all collective actions, mainly sovereign, relating to wild or domestic animals, their services and their production, particularly those entering the food chain, which aim to preserve human and animal health – including welfare – and the health of ecosystems. It thus contributes to sustainable development and the implementation of the 'One Health' concept."
